Walter Schwede, *violin*

Violinist Walter Schwede began studying when he was eight years old and was selected concertmaster of the School Orchestra of America in 1965. After undergraduate work at the University of Michigan, four years with the U.S. Air Force ensemble Strolling Strings and completing his Masters at Catholic University of America, he began his Ph.D. at New York University where he also taught violin. Prior to joining the Seattle Symphony as Associate concertmaster in 1984, he taught at DePauw University, Belmont College, and was a member of the Nashville Symphony. He joined Western's music faculty in 1997. At Western he teaches violin and coordinates the string and chamber music programs.



Join the Rawson Duo and Walter Schwede for an exciting performance project featuring Baroque string orchestra works, including the Bach D minor Double Violin Concerto along with other period masterpieces. Also on the program will be the exquisite quintet for piano and strings in F minor, op. 34 by Johannes Brahms.
